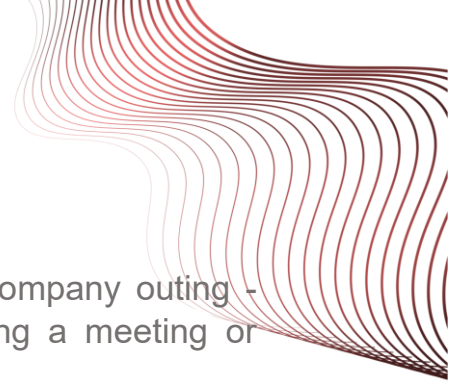
#### How it Works:

Visible and sound-based signals increase the chances of rescue. This immersive experience fosters teamwork, communication, and problem-solving skills, making it a valuable and impactful team-building adventure.
